We have opened the former metal target Handgun Range, located next to the Practical Range, for the shooting of conventional handguns on paper targets only.


New target frames were made for the Plinking and Handgun Ranges. A concrete pad and covered shooting area were also constructed at the Plinking Range.

Range Safety

It has been a long time coming, but the Cumberland Riflemen Range Complex now has a group of members who have been trained as *Range Safety Officers* for our complex.

When you became a member of the Cumberland Riflemen you were told that, in a sense, we were all Range Safety Officers, thus we were responsible for policing ourselves while at the range. Unfortunately, we have reached the point where members have been involved in numerous infractions on the different ranges, some minor and others of a more serious nature. **Therefore, we now have eleven Range Safety Officers that could be patrolling the facility at any given time.** For the most part you might see one

to three RSO's at any given time. We can be seen in plain clothes, or we could possibly be seen in fluorescent safety vests and hats, as seen in the photos. **If the individual identifies him or herself as a Range Safety Officer, they should be shown the respect they deserve as an officer of the club.**

The reason for instituting an RSO Program is to **continue our safety record** on the Cumberland Riflemen Range Complex. We cannot afford any infractions that could possibly close our range down, or affect our **Liability Insurance Coverage**. One mistake can ruin it for our total membership.

Over a month ago, we put up safety signs on all the ranges, the gate, and in the latrine, stating that you can be inspected at any given time for any possible infractions. Actions following any infraction could range from a simple discussion, for a simple violation, to suspension or even termination, as warranted, for a major violation.

We are not trying to become a nuisance to our membership, but we must follow all the updated rules and regulations of Cumberland Riflemen. You are required to read these updated Rules and Regulations and follow them closely. Those updated Rules and Regulations can be found on our new website at:

Tuesday Night High Power League



Gearing up for Tuesday High Power League, and just got this brand new scope. However, I have some doubts. It had catchy advertising and flashy packaging, and the user's manual is simply bizarre. I still think it's just a beer bottle.

Throughout the course of the season, we had 12 shooters participate in the rifle league.

This program is a tremendous way to learn to shoot in situations that may, someday, arise when you least expect. From that snap shot on the hunting field, when you don't have the time to build a shooting bench or seat, and adjust the legs on the bipod or get the sandbag just right, to an emergency situation, where you take a rifle to a gunfight, this is where you learn those skills.

If you can't shoot accurately standing, sitting, or prone, you really need to hone those skills. One fellow member once told me shooting had become boring. You put the rifle on a rest, set the crosshairs over the target, pull the trigger, and the round hits where you aimed. Big deal, he said, no longer seeing a challenge. If you only fire from a sandbag or a \$1,200 rest, you may put them all in the same square inch, and I think you may be an excellent engineer, but are you a shooter?

I talk to numerous guys at the range, and many tell me they'll come out on Tuesdays once they improve their skills and are "ready". Well, in most cases you'll

never be "ready", because of the fear of not being as good as the others or embarrassing yourself in front of them. In the meantime, you're missing out on time which would have been spent **really accelerating** your skills by watching and learning from those same "intimidating" shooters.

I also understand that some of us can't easily get into and out of a sitting or prone position. **So what**, just don't shoot that way then!! We accommodate everyone and every kind of rifle. This is **the best place** for an AR, M-1, or M-1A guy to practice and excel.

Shooters did post some impressive scores over the season. **Lee Nugent** fired a 200-12x from the 200 yard rapid sitting position, and **Rob McKenzie** shot a 200-13x at the 300 yard rapid prone. **Joe Burkel** posted the highest season long averages in sitting and the 600 yard prone. **By the way, Joe Burkel is the reason why so many of us are successful shooters across the course. Mike Flayville and Doug Neder** ran closely as **Most Improved**, and new shooter **Josh Sbrana** showed signs of great things to come.

Twelve shooters from a membership of over 1,200 is a poor showing. Come on out, you won't be disappointed or feel embarrassed. (We only mess with the guys who have been coming out for a while, I promise !) If you have a question, or want more information, my e-mail is below.

Oh yeah, don't forget the end-of-season pizza party. We will save the good natured ribbing until then!



CMP 2023 Season Report

We also had a couple of the “new-ish” Tuesday Night League shooters make a couple of matches, and they also did very well.

Now, however, comes the bad news. There has been a downward trend in match attendance the past 3-4 years, that is also being seen nationwide, but it is really hurting our range as we don't have a lot of high-power shooters here in NJ. We rely on out-of-state shooters to bolster our numbers, and the problem with that is they are dropping off also. I can only assume it is a combination of NJ state laws that are scaring shooters off, the price and availability of ammo and components, and the price of gas, tolls, food etc. Now, more than ever, we need more of our CRI members to become involved in our sport to keep it alive.

We offer guidance, coaching, and even lend new guys equipment to get started. So come on out and give it a try!

Highlights of 2023 season:

Match winners for our Across-the-Course Matches were, in May, Ron Siliani. June, July, Aug., and Sep. all went to Lenny Kurtich. The High-power State Championship went to Tom Foster, posting a 783-29x. The Oct. winner was Ron Siliani again.

GSV highlights were few as attendance was poor to say the least. Lee Nugent set a new range record in the Modern Military Unlimited category with a 295-15x, and Don Zubritsky took third in the M1 Garand Championship. All other awards in the Championship went to out-of-state shooters.

Excellence in Competition highlights were all earned by Lee Nugent, gathering 6 points towards Distinguished Rifleman in the June EIC, and earning another 6 points in October. Lee also set a new range

record for the rapid sitting position, with a 100-7x. That is outstanding!

Joe Burkel won the Iron-man Match with a 479-14x. Pretty good score with iron sights if I do say so myself, LOL.

The Governor's Ten Match was won by Lee Nugent with a fine 292-5x. Rob McKenzie took second and Joe Burkel third.

This year Cumberland Riflemen fielded a team in the Tri-County League, with members Joe Burkel (Team Captain), and shooters Rob McKenzie, Lee Nugent, Kevin Tunney and Al Lihou. The league shoots exclusively at 100 yds, using the High-Power course of fire. There are currently three teams in the league, and we shoot two matches at each range using a 4 man team. If a team has 5 shooters they count the high 4 scores from our team in each position, and you get a point for every position you win vs the two other teams. I'm happy to report that your Cumberland team won the league by a landslide, losing only 4 points over the entire season!

Mid Range Rifle Report

On September 3, 2023 our Cumberland Riflemen Inc. hosted the New Jersey Mid Range & F -Class 600 yard State Championship, with 21 competitors attending. The course of fire for the match is 60 shots, fired in three 20 shot strings, for a possible score of 600. Any safe rifle (bolt or semiautomatic) in any center fire caliber between .223 and .35 may be used with either iron sights or scopes, with no limitation on the power of the scope. However, muzzle brakes are not permitted.

Club member Joe Fogg, who is the Match Director, was the Mid Range Sling State Champion. Dennis Morocco was the F-Class Champion. Congratulations to both !

The first match of 2024 is scheduled for April 7th with matches scheduled for the 1st Sunday of the month April thru October. These matches are open to all shooters, not just club members. So, come out to a match, look at the equipment, ask questions and come back for the next monthly match.




